

Jerusalem Township Board of Trustees Meeting Held on August 28, 2018

The Board of Trustees of Jerusalem Township met in regular session meeting on the above date at 7:00 p.m. in the Office of the Trustees, 9501 Jerusalem Road, Curtice, Ohio 43412

Dave Bench opened the meeting with a moment of silence followed by the pledge of allegiance with the members as listed during roll call:

Approval of Previous Minutes:

Fiscal Officer: Joel Moszkowicz

Joel reported a fund status of \$574,510.88 in pooled investments and \$379,391.43 in our checking account. Also reporting of warrants 16834-16886 to pay in total \$26,864.62. Fire Department: Chief Tony Parasiliti

Tony reported the safety message is the heavy traffic on the roadway, please pay attention and drive defensively. The command and UTV/boat trailer has arrived, labeling is going to start soon from the approved artwork through a vendor in Elmore. Station is getting a thorough cleaning, with the lift and a couple members help, it has been decades since the bay was cleaned this way.

Open house is scheduled for October 3rd from 6 to 9 p.m. A blood drive is scheduled for 10/30 and its being coordinated between Linda Rossler and the Department. The department is part of a regional radio grant that the department and other agencies will be a recipient of. Tony presented a new applicant that has passed the initial interview process, Madeline Rossler.

Maintenance Department: Kevin Chapman

Kevin reported that the new garbage vendor starts next week, but because of the holiday, the service is delayed on day, just for next week. Normal pickup is Teachout road and east, on Thursdays, West of

Teachout is on Friday. East of Turnau road on Thursday, West of Turnau road Friday. Kevin also reported that toters, 96 gallon are for rent through Allstar at he believes 6.00 a month. Also, he reminded the board the limit has increased to 3-32 gallon bags compared to 2-32 gallon bags we had with Waste Management. A flyer is going out through the Metro Press along with the Township website to notify all residents.

Kevin lastly reported that the rec field has been mowed and that the Van Dyke Crossover project might still be completed in 2018.

Barb Gall asked Kevin what the crossover project is about, he stated that it's a culvert repair - replacement on Van Dyke. She also asked about the pot holes on Van Dyke, Kevin indicated he will have those addressed by the end of the year through a vendor we contract with.

Vehicle Logo – Board in agreement to consider putting logo on Township trucks with the same vendor the Fire Department is using for the trailer. Costs estimate are \$100.00 for the truck. Designs need to

be worked out.

Insurance Kiss Family – Beau Miller made a motion to provide up to \$1600.00 each month until 12/31/2018 of medical insurance reimbursement to the Kiss Family. Seconded by Dave Bench with roll call as follows:

Charlie Bickford had asked if that family was eligible for COBRA, both Kevin and the board indicated we did not have enough employees with the same health coverage through the Township which made the family eligible.

Barb wishes it could be made to look better, its disrespectful to the Kennedy family. Beau Miller indicated we should engage the City Schools similar to what Northwood did you develop a outdoor classroom center within the park boundaries.

Charlie Fogel indicated he does not want the park name to change, the board agrees that it will remain the same.
