

Jerusalem Township Board of Trustees Meeting Held on October 22, 2019

The Board of Trustees of Jerusalem Township met in regular session meeting on the above date at 7:00 p.m. in the Office of the Trustees, 9501 Jerusalem Road, Curtice, Ohio 43412

Beau Miller opened the meeting with a moment of silence followed by the pledge of allegiance with the members as listed during roll call:

Joel reported a fund status of \$589,707.92 in pooled investments and \$198,497.59 in our checking account. Also reporting of warrants 17882-18126 and electronic payments 150-2019 through 152-2019 totaling \$97,992.31. We had deposits totaling \$20,016.70 since last meeting. Old Business:

- 1. Repairs Hall Dave Bench has not heard back from Masonry company and might consider cancelling any repairs until next year.
- 2. Brown and Turnau Road Dave Bench reported work was completed last week and should see reimbursement from storm water money.
- 3. Ditch Petition Dave Bench reported no update at this time.
- 4. Dike Update / Metroparks Mark Sattler reported he spoke with Tim from the Metroparks and that a spur dike will be completed by the Geo Gradel company that will address any failure of the legacy dike. As far as addressing the legacy dike he has no update.
- 5. 911 Consolidation Mark Sattler recapped the overall structure of the consolidation committee, timeframe and financial implications for the Township. There is a meeting this Thursday, October 24th at 6:00 p.m.

Tony Parasiliti has concerns he will bring up at his Lucas County Chiefs meeting regarding the County dispatching will handle any department specific procedures. The board agrees that they are not in support of any consolidation of dispatching and feel the entire process is being rushed causing large concern for many.

Dave Bench made a motion against consolidation of dispatching through Lucas County. Seconded by Beau Miller with roll call as follows:

- 6. Trick or Treat Times Beau Miller made mention again of decided time from last meeting for Halloween Trick or Treating. It has been shared with the media, Facebook and township website.
- 7. Electric Bill Intersections Joel Moszkowicz shared already information form the Edison and Lucas County Engineer. The board wants to work to see how those intersections can be paid for, what cost savings can work thru. The board was reminded that the general fund does not have the money to pay for these lights on State / County roadways. Beau Miller asked Joel Moszkowicz for the Edison contact, he will email after the meeting.
- 8. Charter Communication Beau Miller spoke with our local government representative and will

know more about areas without Time Warner service after the study is completed by Charter.

- 9. O.D.O.T. Beau Miller reported that he has reached out to Mark Bressler about failed tile on Jerusalem road. Mark will speak with Beau later regarding the work that needs to be done and when that could be scheduled. It was a positive conversation.
- 10. Sand Bags Dave Bench spoke with a local concrete bag company; they are not willing to bag sand bags but was directed to a local salt bagging company on York to connect with. Dave Bench asked Kevin to follow up with the City of Oregon regarding what kind of quantity to they need.

- 1. Davis Besse Dave Bench mentioned he will be attending the meeting tomorrow at 8:45 a.m.
- 2. Coyotes Mark Sattler received complaint from a citizen regarding sightings on South Cousino road. The board is unable to address any concerns of these wild animals.
- 3. Oregon Dispatch Joel Moszkowicz shared from the City of Oregon Police department a resolution that needs to be made to accept the 2020 dispatching fees for the Fire Department.

Mark Sattler made a resolution accepting the 2020 dispatching fee costs in the amount of \$ 11,709.30. Seconded by Beau Miller with roll call as follows:
